A Reminder About Digital Citizenship for Our Older Students

Monitoring Your Child's Digital Footprint

As our children navigate an increasingly digital world, staying informed about their online activities is crucial. We've recently become aware of group chats involving some of our students that do not reflect the values and standards we uphold at Green Bay Trinity Lutheran School. These conversations contained inappropriate language and content that doesn't represent our school community.

This situation serves as an important reminder for all of us to regularly check our children's devices and online interactions. Take time this week to review your child's group chats, social media accounts, and messaging apps. Many parents are surprised by what they discover during routine checks - from concerning conversations to apps downloaded without permission.

Consider implementing these simple monitoring practices:

- Review group chat conversations weekly
- Check browser history regularly
- Discuss appropriate online communication that reflects our Christian values
- Know all passwords to your child's devices and accounts

Insights from "The Anxious Generation"

Jonathan Haidt's groundbreaking research in "The Anxious Generation" provides compelling evidence about the impact of digital technology on our children:

- Children who receive smartphones before age 14 show significantly higher rates of anxiety and depression
- Social media use correlates with a 27% increase in anxiety symptoms among pre-teens
- Between 2010-2019, rates of adolescent depression doubled, coinciding with widespread smartphone adoption
- Group chats often become spaces for social comparison, exclusion, and cyberbullying
- Adolescent girls are particularly vulnerable to social media's effects, with rates of self-harm increasing dramatically
- Screen time directly reduces face-to-face social interaction, physical activity, and sleep—all critical protective factors for mental health
- Delaying smartphone access until high school can significantly protect mental wellbeing

Haidt's research suggests that the combination of smartphones, social media, and group chats has created a "perfect storm" for youth mental health. The constant connectivity, social pressure, and access to concerning content has fundamentally changed childhood in ways that our community needs to address together.

Your involvement in your child's digital life isn't invasion—it's protection. By maintaining open conversations about online activity, we can help our children develop healthy digital habits that align with our school's values while safeguarding their mental well-being.

Let's work together to create a supportive digital environment that reflects the Christian character we strive to build at Green Bay Trinity Lutheran!





Spring NWEA MAP Testing Tips for Success

As our spring NWEA MAP testing window approaches, here are some practical tips to help your child perform their best:

Understanding MAP Testing

- Purpose: MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) tests are designed to measure your child's academic growth throughout the school year in reading, language usage, and mathematics.
- Adaptive Testing: Unlike traditional standardized tests, MAP adjusts the difficulty of

questions based on your child's responses, creating a personalized assessment experience.

- Growth Focus: Rather than comparing students to each other, MAP measures individual growth over time, helping identify each student's unique learning path.
- Instructional Tool: Teachers use MAP results to identify strengths, pinpoint areas for improvement, and tailor instruction to meet your child's specific needs.

Why MAP Testing Matters

- Provides objective data about your child's academic progress
- Helps teachers identify skill gaps that might otherwise go unnoticed
- Allows schools to measure the effectiveness of curriculum and teaching methods
- Supports differentiated instruction in the classroom
- Enables more informed discussions during parent-teacher conferences
- Prepares students for the experience of standardized testing in higher grades

Before Test Day

- Ensure your child gets plenty of sleep the night before testing
- Provide a nutritious breakfast on test mornings
- Maintain your regular routine to minimize stress
- Speak positively about the test as a way to show what they've learned
- Remind your child that MAP tests adjust to their level - questions will get harder as they answer correctly

On Test Day

- Make sure your child arrives at school on time
- Send them with a water bottle and a healthy snack
- Encourage them to read directions carefully and take their time
- Remind them it's okay to not know every answer

Remember that MAP tests measure growth over time and provide valuable data to help teachers customize instruction for your child's needs. If you have specific questions about the testing schedule or your child's results, please contact your classroom teacher.



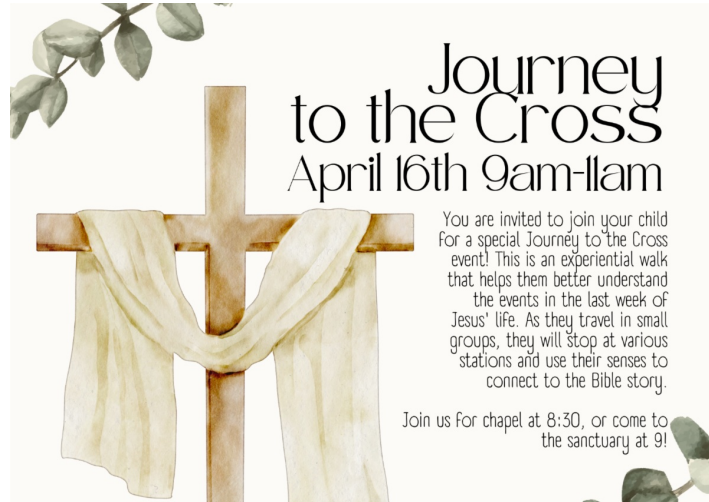
From the AD




